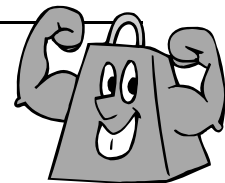

THE PROGRAM

The program at YCamp is designed to emphasize small group activities within the total camp program. Activities, programs, and special presenters are designed to complement the theme of each week and be developmentally appropriate for each age group. Youth will be divided into three groups and each will have their own base "camp". The quality, trained staff include full-time YMCA staff and counselors who specialize in crafts, recreation, athletics, science and nature. Activities include:
